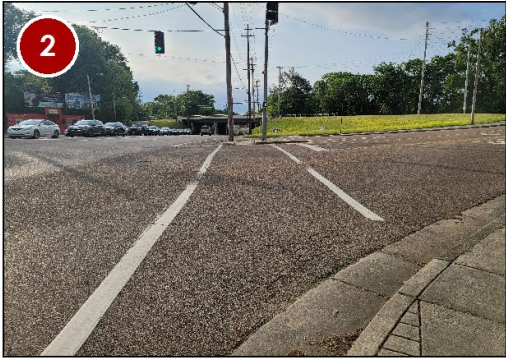
BREAKOUT STATIONS

Existing conditions of the anchors are shown followed by examples of public improvements. Look over the existing conditions and let us know if there is an issue that can be addressed by public improvements such as ADA accessibility, street lighting, improved crosswalks, trash cans, or improved bus shelters. If you are unsure, let us know what the issues are at the anchor, such as speeding, poor sidewalk conditions, no shade at a bus stop or along the street, or unsafe crossing conditions for pedestrians.

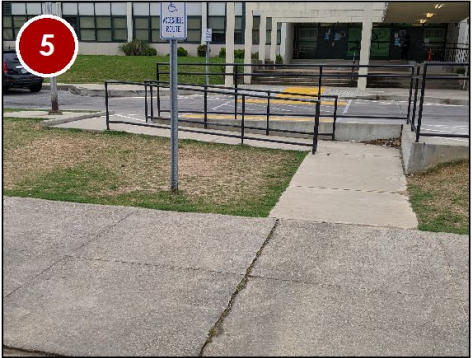
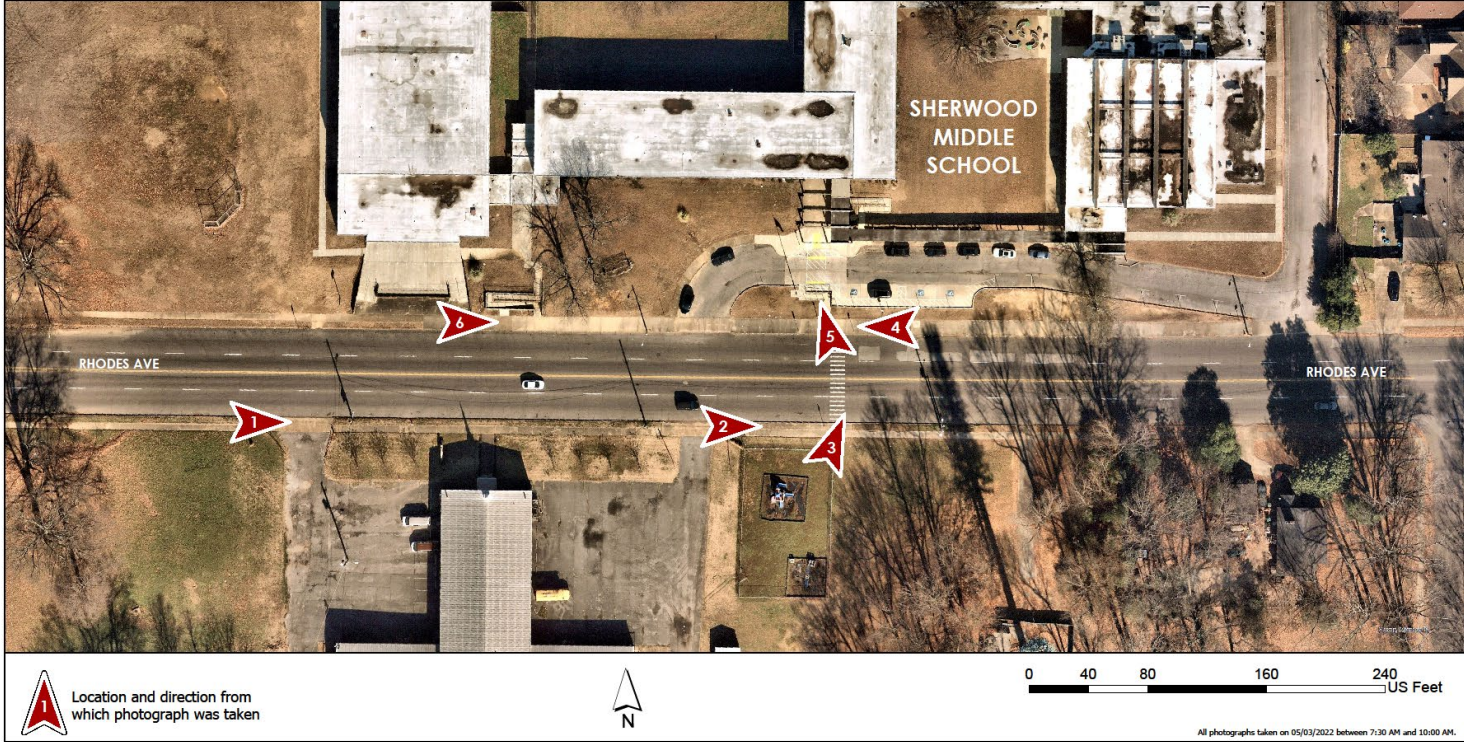

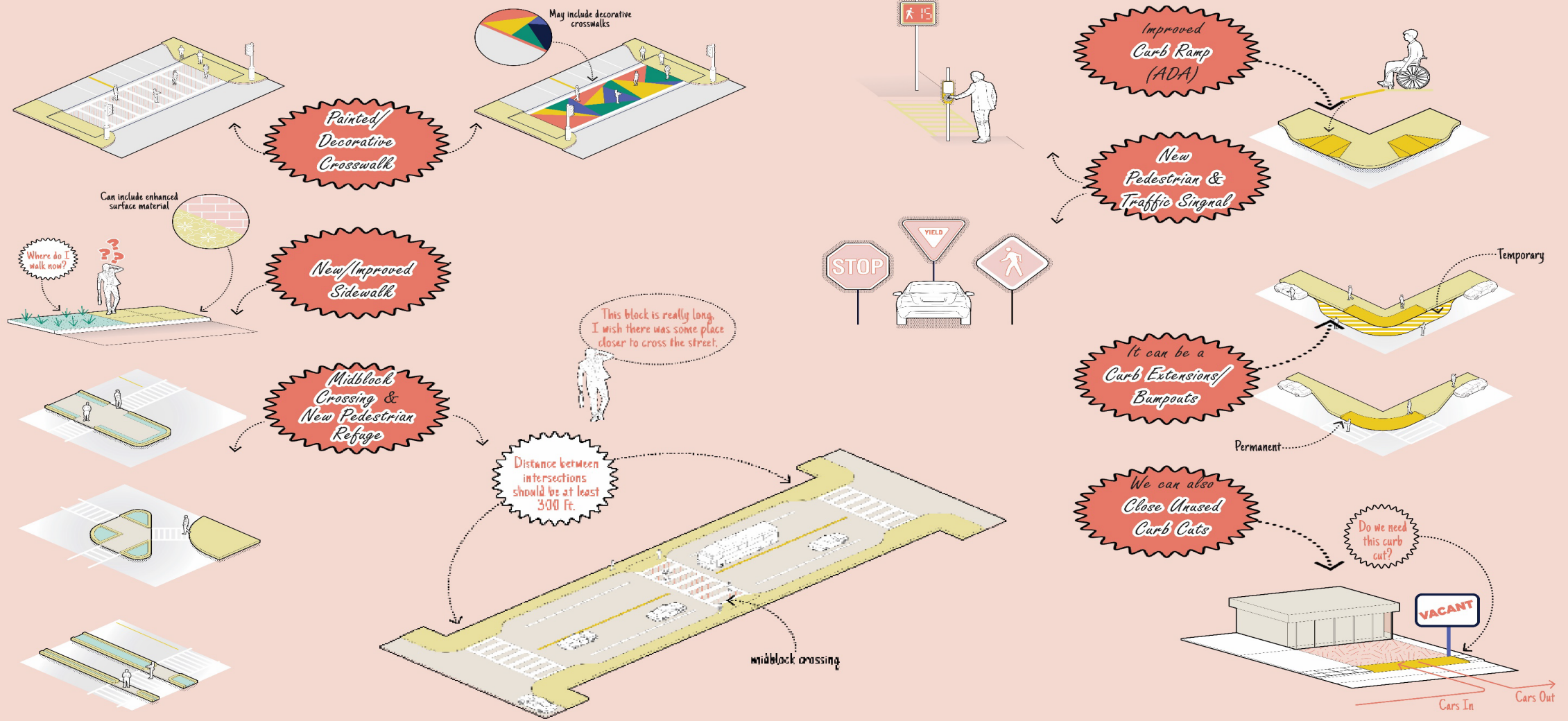


PARK AVENUE AT GETWELL ROAD



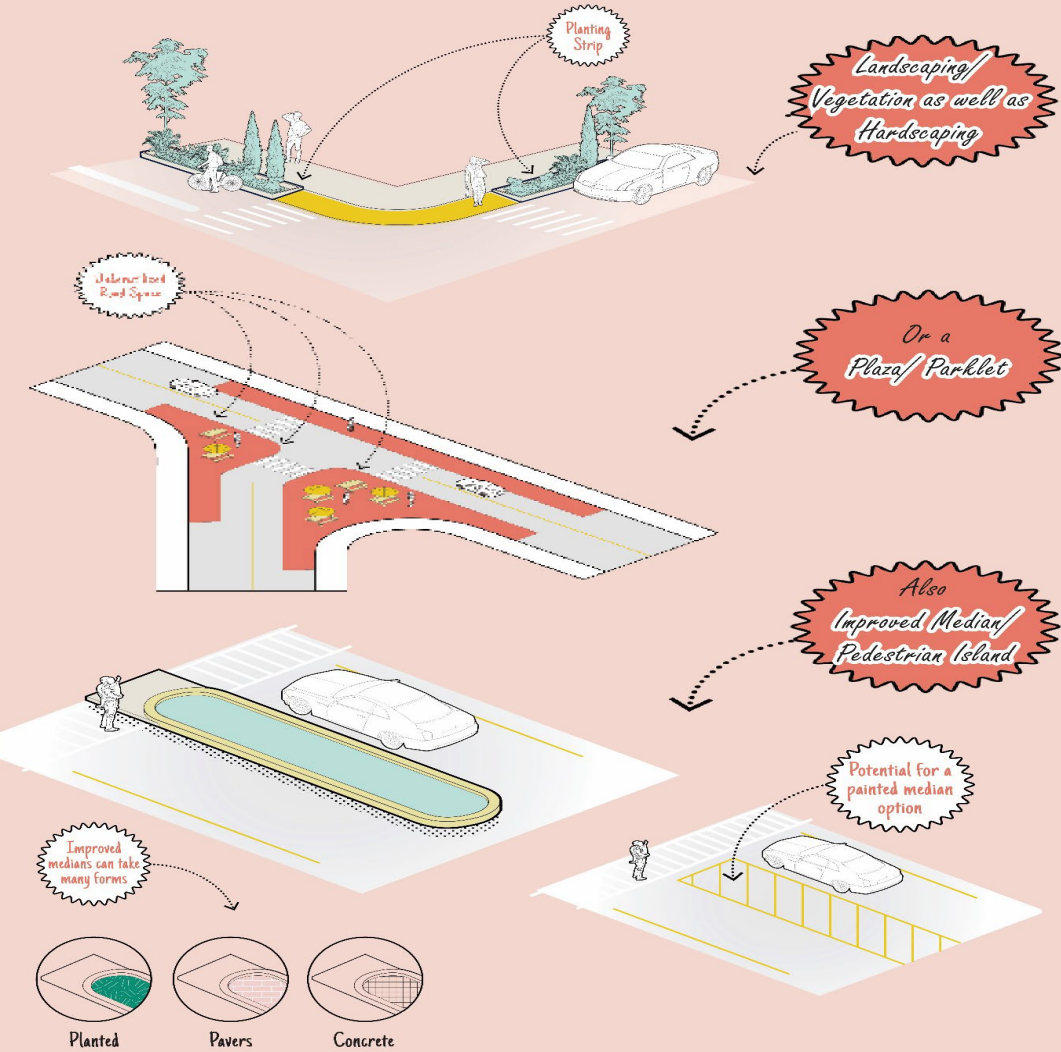
